

Accessible Buildings: A Quick Checklist

Exterior	 Ensure routes to the building entrance are stable, firm and slip-resistant Mark accessible parking spaces with the International Accessibility symbol Ensure the route to your entrance is at least 36 inches wide Use sand, not salt, in the winter
Entrance	 Paint entrance doors in a colour that contrasts with surrounding surfaces Install tactile warning strips on entrace stairs Install glare free lighting Secure carpeting or mats at edges
Interior	 Leave at least 36 inches in aisles and pathways Mark all tripping hazards Install seating for queues and waiting areas Ensure popular items are at medium height on shelves
Signage	 Install large, colour contrasting signage to indicate the building name and address Clearly indicate the location of an accessible entrance Offer alternative formats such as large print, or electronic formats Install tactile signage
Washrooms	 Install alternative types of signage (Braille, raised letters, symbols) Install automatic door opener Install grab bars Ensure faucets and dispensers are within easy reach of a wheelchair user
